

HOSA Students Compete at International Conference



Simpson County Technical Center Pilots Health Infomatics Program

Beginning with the current school term, Simpson County Technical Center is piloting the only Health Informatics Program for the state of Mississippi. It is part of the Southern Regional Education Board's (SREB) Advanced Career Academy. The Health Informatics pathway introduces students to the discipline through a series of authentic projects that merge information science, computer science and health care. Through real - world projects, students use information technology, data analysis software and statistics to address a range of health related topics.

Each course is designed around project-based units — featuring essential questions, project descriptions, authentic roles and tasks that require students to utilize an industry-recognized decision-making process. Students collaborate and work in teams and develop important 21st-century skills.



Health Informatics will appeal to students who have an interest in using technology and software to analyze data about health care and related fields, resulting in better decisions by consumers and health – care providers.

Simpson County Technical Center is under the leadership of Dr. Bo Huffman, Director of Career and Technical Programs for the Simpson County School District.

Jones County Students Compete in SkillsUSA

Shaden Bethel of Laurel won first place in the SkillsUSA National Championship Competition in Job Skill Demonstration A. The SkillsUSA Championships, held in Louisville, KY, took place June 20-24, 2016, as part of the SkillsUSA 52nd annual National Leadership and Skills Conference (NLSC), a showcase of career and technical education students. During the week, more than 6,000 outstanding career and technical education students—all state contest winners competed hands-on in 99 different trade, technical and leadership fields.

Shaden Bethel is a Junior at A P Fatheree/Jones County Career and Technical Center and Northeast Jones High School. The Job Skill Demonstration Competition is a contest designed for competitors to demonstrate a job skill they have learned in their field of study. Shaden Bethel is a student in the Automotive Service Technology program and took his skills that he learned about starters to win a gold medal, beating 39 other first place winners from the other states represented at the national competition.

Others students who competed at the SkillsUSA National Championship were Maggie Davis of Ellisville and Savannah Holifield of Laurel.

Maggie Davis is a Junior at A.P. Fatherree/Jones County Career and Technical Center and South Jones High School. She is an Architectural Drafting and Design student. Maggie Davis competed in T-shirt Design and placed 5th out of 30 national competitors.

Savannah Holifield is a Junior at A.P. Fatherree/Jones County Career and Technical Center and West Jones High School. She is an Architectural Drafting and Design student. Savannah Holifield competed in Promotional Bulletin Board and placed 6th out of 43 national competitors.
